

#### Atmospheric ammonia in-situ long-term monitoring: review worldwide strategies and recommendations for implementation

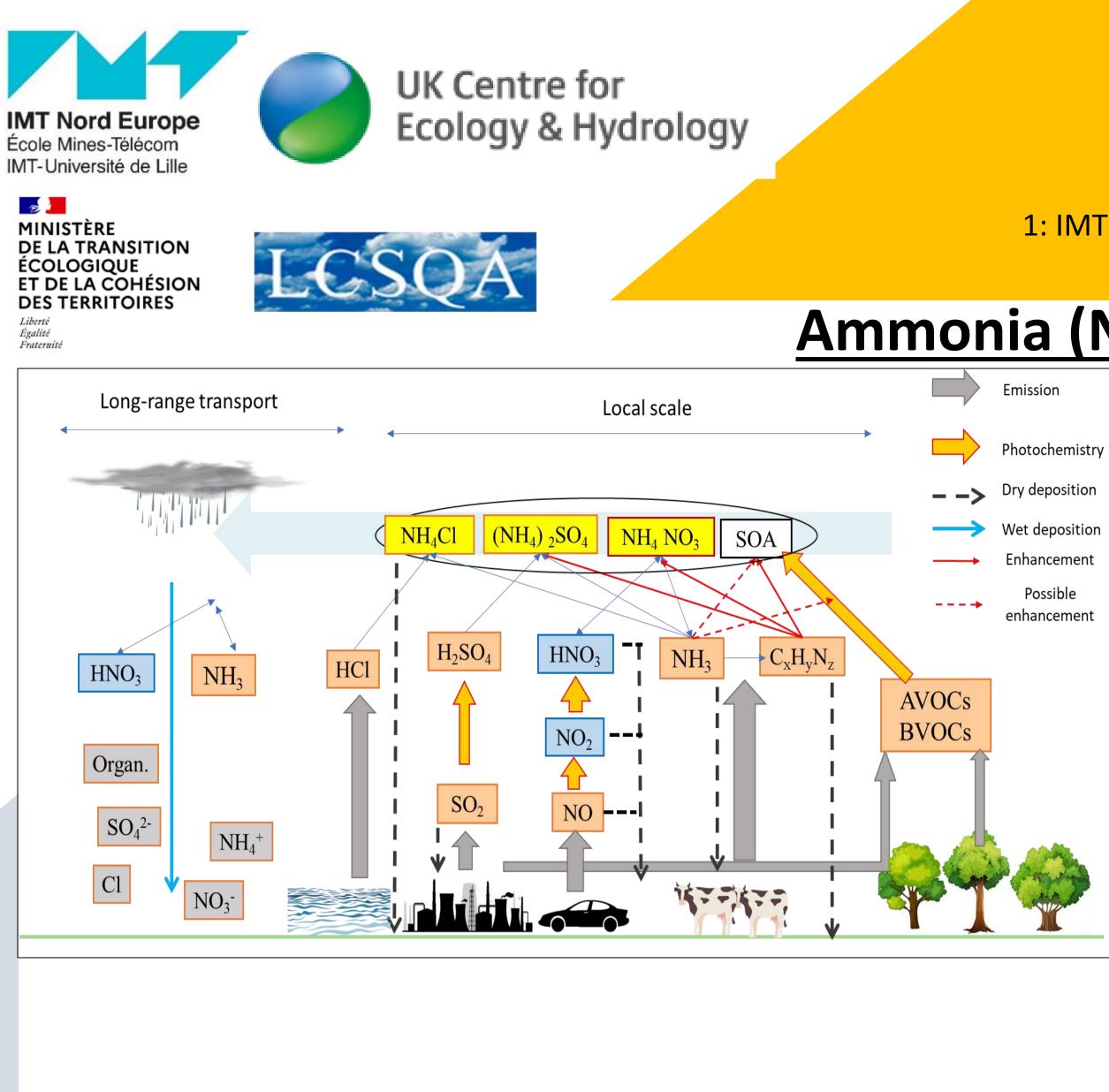
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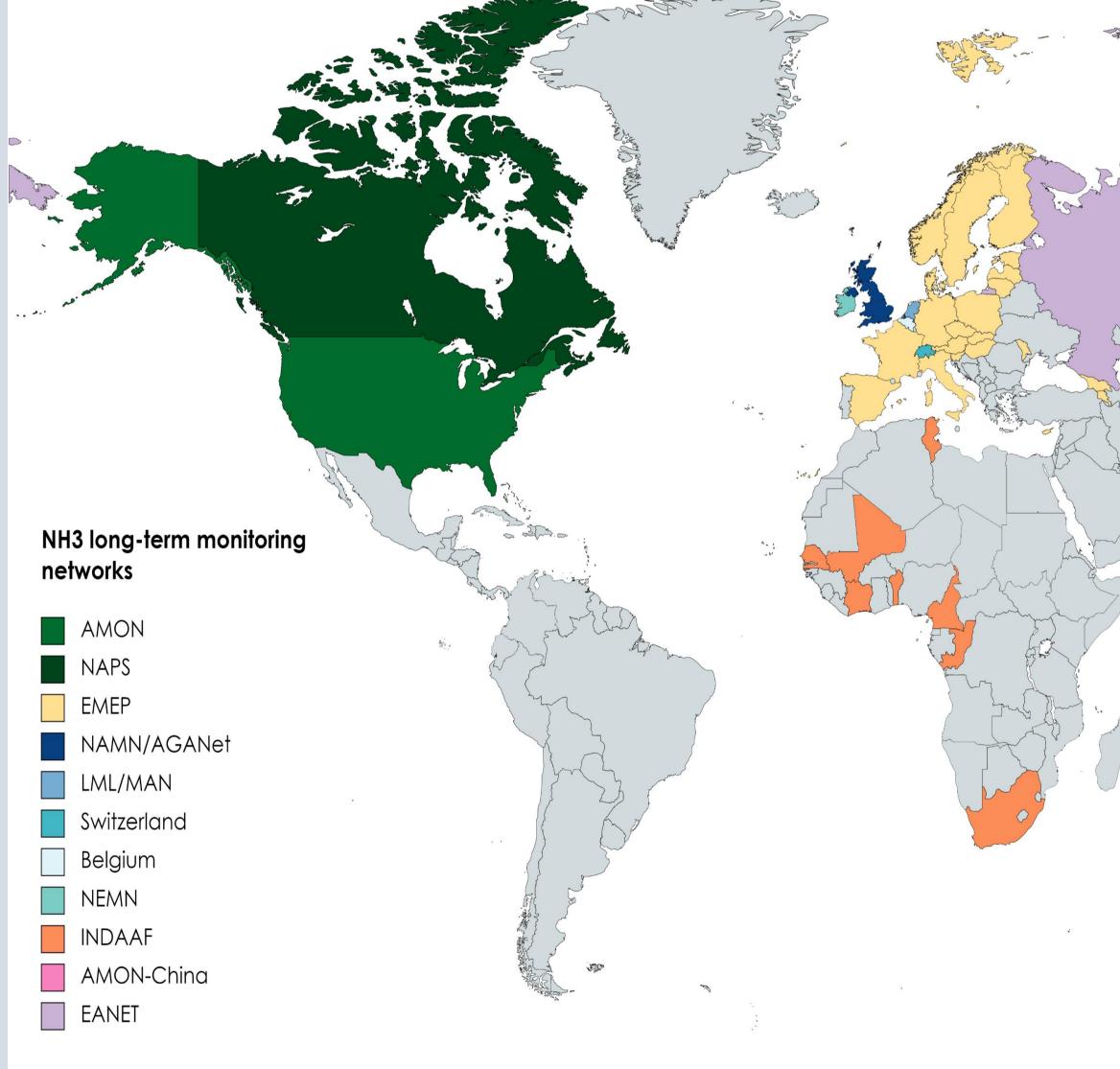
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In the near future, the number of NH<sub>3</sub> monitoring networks using FAIR data-archiving is expected to increase to better evaluate AQ objectives and follow the long-term changes in N<sub>red</sub> deposition. In this poster, we propose some recommendations and approaches used by current long term monitoring networks:

- Co-locate with established monitoring sites to minimise costs, where possible.
- Smaller countries may share monitoring sites with surrounding countries to keep running costs low.
- Tiering monitoring sites by mixing passive monitoring methods with high temporal monitoring methods provides spatial distribution and evidence of the sources and processes driving the reported NH<sub>3</sub> concentrations.
- The spatial strategy of having a high number of monitoring sites equipped with passive samplers 4. allow to achieve objectives 1,2,3, and 5. Local site operators (LSOs) can help identify local sources of  $NH_3$  and can potentially decrease the operational costs.

## **Atmospheric ammonia in-situ long-term monitoring: Review of worldwide strategies and recommendations for implementation**

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### <u>Ammonia (NH<sub>3</sub>): Atmospheric role</u>

- Major alkaline gas in the atmosphere: mainly agricultural sources.
- Forms secondary salts, mostly on the fine particle fraction ( $PM_{25}$ ).
- Dry and wet deposition: causes damage on ecosystems, eutrophication and acidification issues.
- Recent studies suggests it enhances new particle formation.

Reductions in NH<sub>3</sub> emissions and ambient concentrations are necessary to improve air quality (AQ) and recover sensitive ecosystems<sup>1</sup>. Worldwide there are relatively few long-term national and continental NH<sub>3</sub> concentration monitoring networks. There is not yet information from South America, Southwestern Asia, large parts of Africa and Oceania. The aim of this study is to review current networks and provide recommendations for setting up future NH<sub>3</sub> long-term monitoring.

# **Recommendations for future NH<sub>3</sub> monitoring networks**

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### Long-term monitoring networks: Main objectives pursued

- Estimate regional NH<sub>3</sub> concentrations and establish national NH<sub>3</sub> baselines. Assess spatial & temporal patterns at short-term and long-term driving NH<sub>3</sub> concentration variability.
- Estimate impacts caused by NH<sub>x</sub> deposition in ecosystems and protected areas.
- Apportion the origin of the reduced nitrogen (N<sub>red</sub>) deposition and/or estimate the N<sub>red</sub> deposition fluxes.
- Assess the effectiveness of mitigation strategies and inform the grand public on AQ changes.
- Validate and/or calibrate models (chemical transport, dispersion, emissions...). 6.

gh temporal resolution active monitoring is advised to identify NH<sub>3</sub> temporal changes drivers and, within TRIS, EMEP and WMO-GAW, traceable protocols should be developed and tested and include pre-existing works using continuous wet methods (MARGA in UKEAP), spectroscopic methods (miniDOAS in LML & lgium) and other new technologies.

ta should be made open access via an online data repository, where possible. Information's such as the network operational conditions and QA/QC protocols are also beneficial.
